

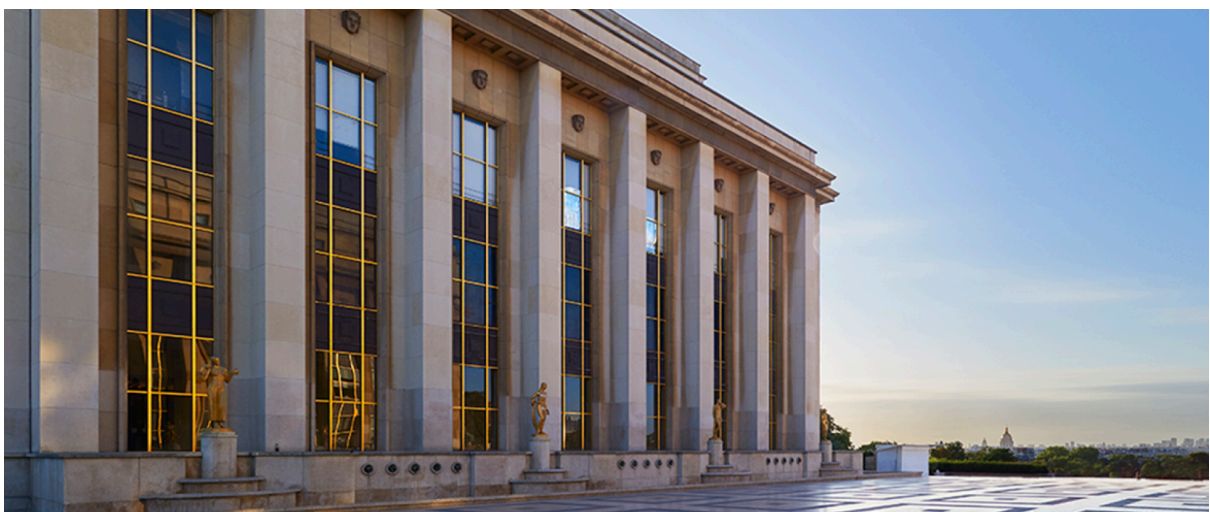


Champagne Gosset announces an institutional partnership with the Cité de l'architecture et du patrimoine

The oldest Wine House in Champagne has decided to implement a cultural sponsorship initiative that aligns with its values and its actions in the field of heritage.

Indeed, Maison Gosset has always been committed to preserving and passing on its expertise and love for heritage, as demonstrated by the creation of the Trophée Gosset in 1995, which rewards individuals and institutions that protect and transmit French know-how and heritage.

It is also the only Champagne House that is both a permanent member of Excellence Française and has been awarded the state label "Entreprise du Patrimoine Vivant" (EPV) since 2013. Maison Gosset is part of the Champagne Hillsides, Houses and Cellars, which were inscribed on the UNESCO World Heritage List, as evidenced by the recent installation of a recognition plaque at the Domaine Gosset in Épernay. It is therefore only natural that Maison Gosset has chosen to undertake a cultural sponsorship initiative with the Cité de l'architecture et du patrimoine.

Through this sponsorship initiative, Maison Gosset continues its deep commitment to supporting the preservation and transmission of expertise and heritage. This action is consistent with a vision enriched by seven centuries of history and Champagne winemaking expertise. In fact, Jean Gosset harvested the family vineyard in Aÿ as early as the 15th century. In 1584, Pierre Gosset founded a wine trading company specializing in still wines, a century and a half before Champagne wines began to be made sparkling. These wines would go on to be enjoyed even at the tables of French royalty, with Champagne Gosset being listed among the wines served at the coronation of King Charles X in 1825.
